ABSTRACT

A subset of children with autism fail to produce a high frequency and variety of speech sounds and therefore vocal responding does not easily become their primary form of communication. Procedures derived from the field of behavior analysis are appearing more often in the scientific literature and are offering increased options for practitioners who work with children with autism. The purpose of this workshop is to provide an overview of the behavior analytic methods that have been shown to increase vocal production in some children with autism. Experimental data and published reports, including those published by the Carbone Clinic in the *Journal of Applied Behavior Analysis* and other scientific journals, will be offered in support of the methods discussed. Video demonstrations and case studies will be presented as illustrations of implementation in educational and clinical settings.

LEARNER OBJECTIVES

1. Participants will be able to describe the benefits of sign language as a method for increasing vocal production.
2. Participants will be able to describe the benefits of transcribing vocal productions during instruction of nonvocal children with autism.
3. Participants will be able to describe the benefits of the shaping process for increasing vocal productions of children with autism.
4. Participants will be able to list at least four (4) evidence-based behavior analytic methods to increase vocal production of children with autism.



BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Vincent J. Carbone is a Board Certified Behavior Analyst-Doctoral with over 30 years of experience designing learning environments for persons with autism and development disabilities. He received his graduate training in applied behavior analysis (ABA) at Drake University, Des Moines, Iowa. He is currently adjunct faculty at Penn State University and visiting professor in the Behavioral Education doctoral program at Simmons College in Boston, MA. His behavior analytic research has been published in several peer-reviewed journals including the *Journal of Applied Behavior Analysis*, *The Analysis of Verbal Behavior*, and *Focus on Autism and Other Developmental Disabilities*. Dr. Carbone currently serves on the editorial review board of several peer-reviewed scientific journals. He has provided the preparatory training and clinical consultation to hundreds of Certified Behavior Analysts in several states. He is the director of a center-based clinic for children with autism just north of New York City in Rockland County, N.Y. The clinic provides consultation, training and therapeutic services to children, families and their instructional teams. He and his clinic staff are currently working with several school districts, agencies and families throughout the United States and overseas. www.carboneclinic.com
